Weeds...how tall is too tall?

City of Omaha code states that weeds (or any vegetation) cannot be over 18" tall. The following steps can be taken if this code is violated:

- A complaint can be filed by anyone
- A City Inspector will send the property owner a 10 day notice to cut the weeds
- If the owner does not respond, the address is put on a mowing list
- Property will be mowed and the owner will be charged according to the size of job







Tom's Tips...

The water heater for your home works like a distillation system. As the water is heated, the various salts and minerals that are dissolved in hard water will precipitate out and collect on the bottom of the tank. The gas water heater is designed so that the flame impinges the bottom and the circulating water then carries away the heat. If enough deposits build up on the bottom, it creates an insulating layer that can cause superheating of the bottom and the resulting stress can crack the water jacket.

The home owner should flush the tank bottom out for about 1 minute, once a month, first thing in the morning (the deposits fully settle when water has not been run recently). This is done with the drain petcock at the bottom of the tank which is threaded to fit a garden hose. I have mine rigged with a long piece of hose all the time (Yes...yes it was, just another senseless lawnmower accident). The princple is the same for electric water heaters. The scale encrusts on the heating elements causing the same improper heat transfer and subsequent burnout of the elements.

Furthermore, all that scale floating around your plumbing system clogs up valves, showerheads and faucet screens. The few minutes that it takes each month can end up being well spent in both the short and long run.
