Sex Offender Information Available

It is important for all citizens of this state to realize that information on Level Three sex offenders (sexual predators who are identified as most likely to reoffend) is public knowledge and is readily accessible. This information is available on the Internet (if you don't have the Internet, access is available free at the public libraries) on the Nebraska State Patrol's website (http://www.nsp.state.ne. us/sor/find.cfm). When you type in the city and zip code, you will be able to obtain information on those Level Three offenders who reside in that area. The site provides clear pictures, addresses, dates of birth, physical descriptions, and information concerning the types of crimes committed and when the individual was convicted. Once you access this information, talk to your neighbors and children about avoiding this individual. By law you are not allowed to harass this person, but if you notice that this person is acting in inappropriate ways or does not live at the address listed on the website, notify the police immediately. Take the time to go to this website and find out if these types of individuals are living in the neighborhood. Help keep our children safe.




A participant in the summer youth program at the Gifford Park Community Garden, Anna Carlson, displays the fruits (or vegetables) of her labors.


SAFE Tour Makes Stop In Gifford Park

Identity Theft Update: Protecting Personal Information

- Before you give out your personal information, ask your bank, doctor's office, other businesses, and your employer how they will use the information, who will see it, and how they will protect it.
- Never carry your Social Security Card or number, birth certificate, or passport unless necessary.
- Do not have your social security or driver's license numbers printed on your
- Do not put your address, telephone number, or driver's license number on a credit card receipt.
- Never give identifying information over the phone unless you initiate the
- Never give identifying information over a cordless or cellular telephone.
- Shred all financial or confidential information (including pre-approved credit card applications) before discarding.
- Keep a list of your credit card and bank account numbers, expiration dates, and phone numbers in a safe place.
- Store seldom-used credit cards in a safe place; consider canceling the account altogether and cut up credit cards before discarding.
- Carry only the credit cards you plan on using.
- Do not use your mother's maiden name as a password.
- Unless your mailbox is secure, mail payments at the post office, and pick up checks at the bank.
- Get a free copy of your credit report once a year online at www.annualcreditreport.com or by calling 877-322-8228. Check to make sure your report is accurate.
- Two key indicators that your identity has been stolen are that your monthly credit card and bank statements suddenly stop arriving in the mail, and you are denied credit for no apparent reason.
